In the 1920s, Woodstock was a popular tourist destination and had one of the first “tourist camps” at Southside Park – complete with electric kitchen, swimming, dances and band concerts.

The Perry Street Arena in Woodstock opened its doors January 6, 1914 and closed April 20, 1996. When first built, it was a state-of-the-art facility and only the second arena in Canada to feature an automatic stop time clock. The arena hosted many activities over the years’ including hockey, lacrosse, roller skating, circuses, wrestling, broomball, dances, and, of course, many skating club circuses. Many people of notoriety graced the ice including, Howie Morenz, Rocket Richard, Gordie Howe, Bobby Hull, Elvis Stojko and Petra Burka. When the arena shut its doors for the last time it was the oldest rink in Ontario.
